The club really appreciates the time you have put into coaching our juniors.

Thank you to all the other parent volunteers that keep each team kicking over in their own way. These include - managers, assistant coaches, scorers, pitch counters and umpires.

Over the last 12 months, Ruth Richter (also our Registrar) and Jaqui Rota have been working on a new child protection policy for the MSBC. This document with its related links and contacts will be available on the Seaside's website over the next few weeks (or earlier if we can get a website volunteer). This is a very current and thorough document and thank you both for the work put into it.

We have also started on the designs and negotiations with the Council for the upgrading of the grounds at John Fisher and the installation of batting cages. There is a subcommittee involved but it also needs help to get it moving a bit faster as we are at the point of getting quotes and then in search of grant funding. Thanks to Dwayne, Brendan, Paul L, Gav and Mark G for their time on this.

I am stepping down from the President role this year. It been an honour to lead this traditional local baseball club that I played for as a junior a long, long time ago and still play for now. I'd like to thank all of the Seaside's families for their support during my time as President and I look forward to supporting our next President in taking the club forward.

Treasurer's Report 2020/21

Following this report are the financial statements for the year ending 28th February 2021.

As of 28th February 2021, the club had net funds of \$70,947.45 which is \$12,333.46 more than last year and includes allotted funds of \$35,000 to the building fund.

As usual, the total assets represents cash funds and does not take into account the other assets owned by the club including equipment, uniform inventory, and team kits and other physical assets such as the BBQ, signage, maintenance gear etc which are not recorded on the balance sheet, as they have been expensed on acquisition.

Despite the disrupted season, the canteen continued to make a solid contribution to the club. The figures include the last 2 weeks of the finals last season. I would like to thank the Gunnings for the smooth running of the canteen, and everyone in the club who makes it a bit of a social hub after the games.

Part of the growth in club assets is also for cyclical reasons. We did not make any major equipment purchases this year having in recent years bought amongst other things the pitching machine, L nets, new line marking machine and BBQ. We also spent less on uniform inventory.

Thankfully, the registration system processed the Active Kids vouchers directly this year, which despite a few glitches seemed to work smoothly for most people and was a lot less work for the club.

I would like to thank our sponsors, Balgowlah RSL, Display Solutions, Bendigo Bank Freshwater, Artifex Interiors, All Sports Apparel, and Chubbs. Your support is much appreciated. The Chubbs Player of the Match vouchers have been keenly sought after.

I would also like to thank my fellow Committee members, and all the parents who have helped their team or the club in some capacity during the year.

I hope everyone had a great season and hope to see everyone again next year.

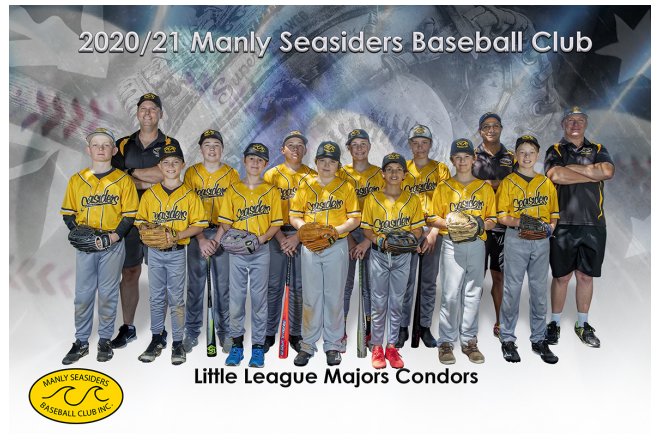

Thank you also to the large coaching staff for the Eagles this season! Your support and expertise have been invaluable.

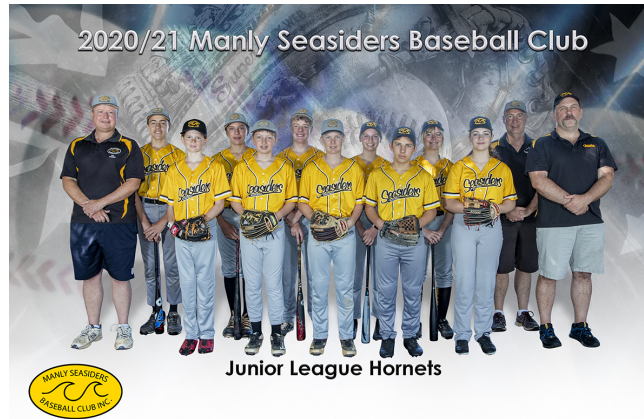

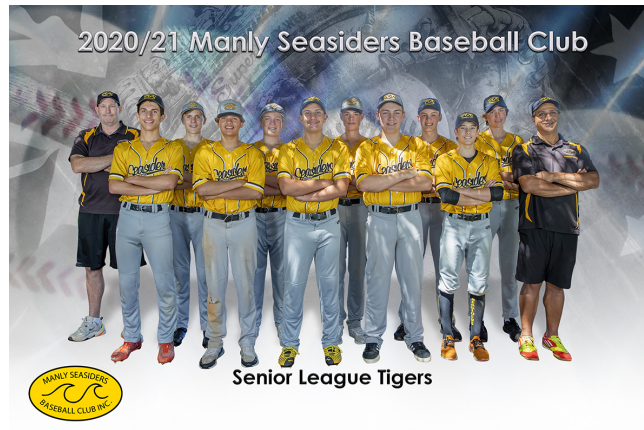

Special mention to Ash for playing up an age. He can really crush that ball! Jaylen has been our main catcher and has been great behind the plate but also a real leader in the team.

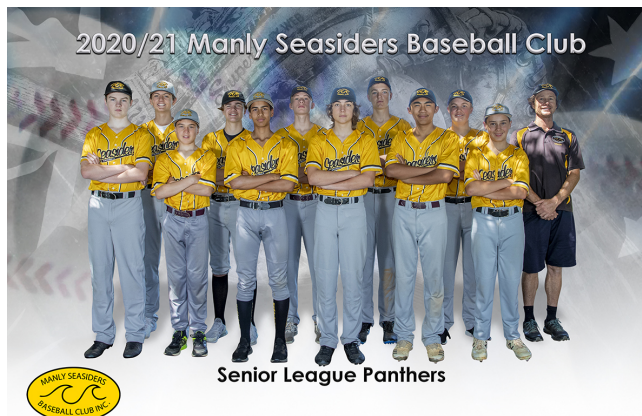
