

Their first ever season was an enjoyable one for the ten girls and three boys who made up the U8 Bees.

The team managed to go through the season undefeated – without winning a single game! Such is the joy of the U8's where no one keeps score and everyone makes it home.

We had three aims for the kids this season:

- To begin what will hopefully become a lifelong love of baseball;
- To ensure they learnt the correct techniques of hitting, catching, throwing and base running to prepare them for the more competitive years ahead; and
- To use their involvement in the team as a vehicle to develop their characters the qualities of courage, resilience, respect, teamwork and that mix of self-confidence and humility that is essential to help them become better players, friends and citizens.

At our first game a couple of players were so intimidated about hitting the ball off a tee that they burst into tears! But as we headed into the Christmas break those same players and the rest of the team were hitting and throwing with power and confidence.

Catching for most of our kids is still a work in progress, but that will come next year with more practice.

There were no standout players in the team, so every child deserves a mention:

Alana personified one of our team goals – to have fun. She always had a smile on her face and was a consistent performer with both the bat and glove.

Anika was one of the team's real improvers. Her hitting got better and better as the season progressed and her catching was also strong. In one game she got two outs on third base.

Carly was the team's best catcher and one of its top throwers and hitters. She played particularly strongly at first base where she achieved a number of outs.

Emily was the first member of the team to tag a runner out. The powerful hitter of the final part of the season was unrecognisable from the shy, timid player who first stepped up to the plate in September.

We will always remember our wins this year where the team truly came together in both field and batting, but also because the wins were so few and far between this season! The losses were many but more than offset by the team's willingness to be together and show proper spirit for the game. For young people to wipe off the previous weeks' loss and get back in the game each week, re-focus at training, find their confidence, try new skills, and give their best on game day as a team was truly a privilege and pleasure to oversee. To have that level of persistence in each of players is not just a sports skill, but also a valuable skill in life. It was an honour to be their coach again this year with Paul, and watch the young players develop their skills.

The parents and the team can be proud of the Under 9's personal development improvement over the season along with their commitment to the team, their club, and the sport.

Zander Highland – from the calling the play in field, to finding his batting style, and improving his fielding techniques, Zander helped pull the team together as well as finding his own confidence during this season with a genuine ability to comfortably enter live pitching next year. It was Ruby who was instrumental in helping the team to their best win of the season when the pressure was on -1 run behind, with two outs, and full bases – Ruby stepped up to the plate and delivered.

Consistent at training and at the games, Ruby played in all positions in the field and by the end of the season would connect and make first base in most games.

Gus Goddard – still the fastest lad with natural ability, sadly he had to leave mid-season to move overseas. A truly reliable performer, he could not have been more proud when his team gave him his farewell. Team spirit is what makes a great team and Gus was certainly recognized by his team mates when he had to leave. Always arriving to training and the game with a focused attitude, he will achieve great things in future years and knows what it means to be a valuable member and part of a team.

Liam Lidgard — one of the most committed players in the team and always willing of trying new positions and techniques including being catcher on the hottest of days to get his eye in. By the end of the season was always delivering with the bat sending many of his team mates home. He put in the extra effort at every training session as well as outside of training and this produced a significant improvement in all aspects of his game throughout the season. Liam is certainly an all-round player who understands the strategy of the game and could be a pitcher in the future as he gains confidence and strength in his ability to throw. He has proper technical understanding and will achieve great things in coming years as he continues to invest time perfecting his game. Liam is ready for live pitching next season.

Noah Stone – by the end of the season, Noah would connect at least once during a game and get to first base. Noah can be proud of his improvement during the season. He developed his ability to throw using proper baseball techniques and improved his catching ability significantly throughout this season. Another season in Zooka will see him shine, improve his skills, and confidence. He can comfortably enter another year of Zooka and see success next year.

Monty Buckley – whilst being the youngest player in the team, it is always a pleasure to watch the outfield step back when Monty comes up to the plate. His big hits, his ability to catch a hard and fast ball in the glove, and his support of his team mates is the making of a fine young future player. Strong in the infield and comfortable in the outfield, he is hard to get past. Whilst he can work harder on his batting, when he connects, the ball really moves. With more training and greater focus on batting as he grows, he will make an easy shift to live pitching next year. If he sticks with the game he could be a pitcher in years to come.

Chase Murray – always reliable with the bat and certainly keen to be in the outfield, Chase developed a good arm this year to get the ball back from outfield. Whilst he needs to improve his catching, he was responsible for getting many of his team mates home by connecting regularly and often sending the ball in the outfield to gain multiple bases. A great team player, and really gaining focus, he will enjoy another year of Zooka next year and do very well.

Finn Claire – one of the strongest players in the field, he can field a hard ball well and return it fast. When Finn has his focus, he can connect well with the Zooka ball often resulting in some great plays. Equally in the field he can execute fast decisions to result in an out. Finn is happy to play any position in the field well, from catcher to outfield. Finn can be proud of his game development this year and deserves genuine credit for it, especially learning how to predict where a batter will place the ball when fielding. With his focus and positive approach to the game, he will be a true performer in the future and is certainly of sufficient confidence for live pitching next year.

Noah Zingsheim-Smith – always keen to better understand the technical and strategic aspect of the game, he showed a wonderful willingness to give all field positions a go, including catcher, although he is very effective in the infield. Noah develops confidence as he develops greater understanding of the game and we saw his game improve each week as he learnt more. By end of season Noah would consistently connect with the bat and often would play the field well to be smart enough to get home too. Noah should advance next year to live pitching. He has shown great focus this year and as a more strategic player (rather than confidence driven), he is ready. Noah's understanding of the game and skill is at a level that he should progress, especially if he puts in some batting practice in the off season.
